

## Minister's Report

The **June Conference 2003** was held at St. Francis Centre in Mono Mills from June 13th - 15th. There were three topics welded into the three day weekend: Feast of St. Anthony, Celebration of the 750th anniversary of St. Clare's death and of the 25th Anniversary of the Rule. 41 participants enjoyed all or part of the conference. Sister Bernadette Ward, fmm, and Sister Jacque Keefe, CSSF, each gave very good talks on St. Clare. Fr. Peter helped us to appreciate this anniversary of the Rule, and to celebrate the gift it has brought to our lives as Secular Franciscans. The Regional Council presented "Council Roles". Participants actively shared their thoughts on the spiritual and personal qualities needed for a person to fill the role of a council member

We all experienced an enriching weekend of fraternal prayer, eucharist, sharing, good food, and meeting new people. The young people who attended added a new energy to the gatherings. They were especially helpful in setting up and helping others.

It was a great privilege to attend **The Blessings of Penance Seminar** with Father Peter at St. Bonaventure University in New York. Since Fr. Peter has reported on this I will just note one thing that particularly struck me. Anne Mulqueen, ofs, said, "The Blessing of Penance is to have the Holy Spirit of God at work in us. *It is a love relationship initiated by God.*"

On Saturday, August 9th, we attended Franciscan Fest at St. Bonaventure Church in Don Mills. Two high school chaplains and myself helped with the small group sessions with youth. Events included upbeat music, crafts, a petting zoo, a nature/prayer walk through Edward Gardens, interesting speakers, Mass, reconciliation, information booths, and many people to meet. We hope to do it again next year.

In August I visited St. John Vianney Fraternity and was there for the profession of 12 candidates into the order at the closing Mass presided over by Dr. Pio Kim. The spirituality of these Korean people truly reflects Franciscan humility and hospitality. Their music is beautiful, as is their language. I enjoyed meeting and praying with them.

It is with regret that I announce that Irene Paterson has resigned as Secretary of the TRF Council due to ill health. Irene MacIvers has graciously accepted to help us in the role of Secretary at the September 13th meeting. ## Message from our Spiritual Advisor, Father Peter Knaapen, O.F.M.

During the summer Debbie Tessier, our Regional Minister, and I were fortunate to be able to attend the Fr. Bob Stewart Memorial Seminar at St. Bonaventure University. The Seminar was entitled "The Blessing of Penance, Our Past, Our Future". The Seminar was a celebration of the 25th anniversary of the Pauline Rule. Fr. Bob died of cancer a few years ago. His doctoral dissertation was on the development of the present Rule. He develop it into a Book: *The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order: Origins, Development, Interpretation*. It is available from the Franciscan Institute.

All the speakers were terrific. Half the presenters were Secular Franciscans. Fr. Michael Cusato, OFM, gave a great presentation on *Facere penitentium*. This Latin phrase comes from the Gospel passage of Jesus "repent, (*facere penitentium*) for the kingdom of God is at hand." He pointed out this phrase was not meant by either Jesus or Francis as a passive command. It is not just an 'I'm sorry for my sins' and will make up for them. Rather it is a very positive and active command. Do penance. Do change. Do whatever you need to become more like the Lord. In order words to do penance is the daily challenge to change, to become more like Christ and to do alone can to make the kingdom of God truly present in ones words and deeds. That is truly the blessing of penance.

Sr. Margaret Carney in her presentation encouraged us to reflect on the prologue to our Rule. It is St. Francis exhortation to us on how 'do penance.' The first part of it is entitled 'concerning those who do penance. Francis in the second paragraph says: "oh, how happy and blessed are those men and women when they do these things and persevere in doing them."


As we continue to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Rule and as we celebrate the Feast of St. Francis let us read and reflect on the prologue to the Rule. Let it be for us the 'blessing of penance' and the source of our daily conversion.



Am I answering the call to “*Rebuild My Church*”?




## Fall Retreat






